





### **WORKSHOPS**

#### THE PAINTING TABLE

This workshop is a group activity, led by Roger Hutchison, that features casual, no pressure painting. The session can be faith-based, or it can be designed to fit a more diverse community. If time permits, and participants are willing, they are invite to share about the experience and if they would like, their painting. It is always an inspiring conversation.

A Painting Table session can last anywhere from one hour to a period of meeting weekly for several weeks.

# Changing Landscapes Exploring Story and Its Role in Children's Christian Formation

Roger Hutchison uses the language of "story" to explore the changing landscape of Christian formation for children. We will take a high-level view and will also explore new (old?) ways of forming disciples.

# The Very Best Day – The Way of Love for Children

Introduces the practices for a Jesus-centered life for children ages 3–10 and their families. Using accessible language and ageappropriate themes, it specifically addresses children and the importance of rhythm and practice in their lives as Christians, accompanied by Roger Hutchison's artwork.

Through a cadence of words and colorful images, children will see how to Turn, Learn, Pray, Worship, Bless, Go, and Rest in daily life as a follower of Jesus.

#### **Art and the Passion Story of Christ**

Roger Hutchison uses art to reflect on the stations of the cross, bringing color and fresh insight to the pages of scripture.
